→**START HERE** ← **General Emergency Services Card (101 Card)**

This is your permit/license to legally show up to an exercise or a real world emergency. You have to complete CAP 116T (T=Test) before doing anything else. Follow this link that will also provide a self study power point and link for the test itself.

2) National Incident Management System (NIMS) AKA Incident Command System (ICS)

In order to become fully qualified in any rating you must finish IC-100 and 700. You don't need it for start training but you must do them in order to finish training! If you want to knock out advance training as well, take IC-200 and 800 but that is for advance qualifications such as Ground Team Leader. But you're welcome to take it still.

Note: This is a National Direction for **ALL RESPONDERS** to have this training as directed by Homeland Security Presentational Directive-5 and it's the same course firefighters, Cops, etc all take and its **FREE!**

3) Start working on an E.S. Specialty!

Each rating has its own work sheets to be completed, if you want Aircrew you will start with Scanner, if you want Ground Team work on the Ground Team III.
