



Civilian Fliers Take Oath

Members of the Reno civil air patrol were informed last night that training of the group in various duties necessary for civilian defense would be started soon. The announcement was made at a meeting held in the city hall at which forty-five persons were given the oath of membership by Judge B. F. Curler.

The course of training will in-

clude military discipline and courtesy, first aid, protection against gas, procedure in the event of air crashes, and other subjects. All members of the civil patrol which includes not only flyers, but also nurses, ambulance drivers, horse-men, mechanics, and ground crew personnel will undergo the period of training.

At the meeting, which was pre-

sided over by Morley Griswold, group executive officer, E. J. Questa, wing commander, outlined the functions of the civil patrol, and said that when fully organized, the group would assist various military organizations in patrol duty.

More than sixty persons who have submitted applications for membership were present at the meeting in addition to the present personnel.
