Kirk Loney Gets CAP Promotion

Kirk Loney, 120 Mill St., Reno, long active in the Civil Air Patrol program, has been promoted to the rank of lieutenant colonel, Nevada Wing, Civil Air Patrol.

The announcement was made by Col. Weld Arnold, wing commander, who commended Col. Loney on his splendid record as a charter member of CAP since December 1, 1941.
