




Col Pierce, NVWG Commander

Col Deborah Pierce is a 30-year member of CAP and is the current Nevada Wing Commander. She has served in various command and staff roles in both the California and Nevada Wings and has served on the Pacific Region Staff College staff for the last 14 years, including the past two years as co-director. “Contributing positively to someone’s progression within CAP – and seeing them learn – is very gratifying.” Pierce said.

She has also attained Master Ratings in Professional Development, Personnel and Administration and Senior Ratings in Inspector General and Command in addition to receiving the Gill Robb Wilson Level V award.

Col Pierce is originally from northern Ohio. She came to Nevada through service in the U.S. Navy (Fallon Naval Air Station) in the early 1980s. She really liked Nevada and decided to return when her tour of duty was up. “I first joined Civil Air Patrol when I was stationed at Fallon and was one of the original members of the now defunct Golden Eagle Composite Squadron. My CAP membership lapsed when the Navy sent me overseas.”

Col Pierce graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Accounting from the University of Nevada, Reno (UNR) and also earned a Master of Public Administration (Public Management major) from the California State University, Hayward.”

Col Pierce rejoined CAP at San Jose Senior Squadron 80 when she moved to California upon graduation from UNR. “I still wanted to serve my country but had just started a new career as an accountant.” After four years as an accountant, Pierce changed direction and went into law enforcement. She recently retired as a Lieutenant Commander with the California Highway Patrol with 24 years of service and settled in Reno.



Col Lynn, Region Vice Commander



Col Carol Lynn joined Civil Air Patrol in December 2006. Since then she has served in numerous positions for Nevada Wing including Director of Aerospace Education, Squadron Commander, NV Wing Chief of Staff, NV Wing Commander and is currently the Pacific Region Vice Commander.

Col Lynn has directed and taught at many CAP schools including Unit Commander Course, Training Leaders of Cadets, Squadron Leadership School, Corporate Leadership Course, and Level 1 Course for new members. Her current endeavors include assisting in developing curriculum for the new Leadership Working Group. She has also led the Nevada Host Wing team for the 2014 National Conference.

Col Lynn holds ratings from Technician to Master in several specialty tracks; Aerospace Education, Plans and Programs, Communications, IG, and Command. She has earned an Operations qualification level of Incident Commander I and several other Emergency Services; Scanner, Observer, Logistics Chief, Planning Section Chief, and more.

Col Lynn has earned the highest achievement in the Professional Development program – the Gill Robb Wilson award. Her additional awards and decorations include the Exceptional Service Award, Meritorious Service, Commanders Commendations, and Achievement Awards.

Her career outside of CAP is in education and has spanned over 30 years with several positions from classroom teacher to school principal. She has earned a Bachelors and Master’s Degree and is currently working on her PhD. She is currently employed in the Title I Grant Department for Clark County School District in Las Vegas.

Lt Col Lynch, Chaplain



Lt Col Michael Lynch has been a member of the Civil Air Patrol for 13 years. During that time he has served in a number of positions at the squadron, group, wing, region, and national levels. He is also a member of the Chaplain Corps.

As a member of the California Wing, Lt Col Lynch currently serves the Tehachapi Composite Squadron 46 as Deputy Commander for Seniors. He is also responsible for Safety, Emergency Services, and Communications.

Prior to moving to Squadron 46, Lt Col Lynch was a member of Bakersfield Composite Squadron 121. There he served as Squadron Commander and Deputy Commander of Cadets.

On the civilian side of life, Lt Col Lynch is a firefighter/engineer for the Tulare County Fire Department. He is also pastor of Trinity Southern Baptist Church in Taft, CA. His personal motto is “Always ready to serve God and country”

Ch. Capt Mendenhall, Guest Speaker

Ch. Capt Matthew D. Mendenhall is Chaplain, 432d Wing and 432d Air Expeditionary Wing, Creech Air Force Base, Nevada, which is the Air Force’s First Armed Remotely Piloted Aircraft (RPA) Wing with more than 3,000 U.S. and coalition military members, Department of Defense civilians, and their families. Chaplain Mendenhall provides pastoral care, advises leadership, and facilitates religious accommodation while serving as unit chaplain for the 432th Operations Group and 799th Air Base Group.

Prior to joining the Air Force in August 2015, Capt Mendenhall served more than 22 years in the United States Army. Capt Mendenhall was on active duty for 13 years serving both as an enlisted Sergeant and Chief Warrant Officer Three. While enlisted Capt Mendenhall served in the 3rd US Infantry (The Old Guard) in Washington D.C. He served as the Colors Sergeant performing numerous ceremonies at the White House, Pentagon, and Arlington National Cemetery. As a Chief Warrant Officer Capt Mendenhall served as a helicopter instructor pilot and aviation safety officer. Capt Mendenhall also served 9 years as an Army reservist earning the rank of Captain and commanding Headquarters and Headquarters Troop 1-14th Aviation Battalion (Augmentation), Ft. Rucker, Alabama. From 2008 – 2012 Capt Mendenhall was a Deputy Program Manager for a major defense contractor and led a large Russian Mi-17 Counter Narcotics aviation contract in Kabul, Afghanistan for a total of twenty-two months. From 2012 – 2015 the Capt served as an Executive Pastor for Harvest Bible Chapel Granger in Granger, Indiana. Prior to his current position, the Captain served from 2015 to 2018 as a chaplain assigned to Tinker Air Force Base, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.




Dear Encampment Graduates,







Every front-seat cadet was able to get hands-on time at the controls, and 15 cadets completed their very first orientation flight this week in good weather. 


Physical Training is a required activity at Encampment that teaches cadets how to live a physically and mentally healthy lifestyle during the Encampment. Drill Competition
