

America's First Mounted C. A. P. Units Formed In Reno



TOP: Troop "E," Mounted Command, C. A. P., forms for cavalry drill, south of the golf course. Note army stretcher on horse at extreme right. SECOND: Troop "E" moves into the foothills west of town on maneuvers. Carrying pack two-way radio, this unit will be directed to its objectives by plane.

THIRD: Troop "B" rides to a rendezvous with Troop "E" near Hunter Lake. Both troops, planes, and headquarters maintained
